## Use "Print Preview"



Pint Preview shows how many pages your job will be. Lower left comer or bottom.

(Use "page range" feature, below, to not print unneeded pages.)

This appears after you click on the "Office" button or on File in the upper left. For MS Word, put the mouse over "Pint"

## Use "Page Range"

computers. This means over X\% was wasted.


## Don't print unneeded pages.

Use this option to specify which pagesyou want to print.

## This appears after you click on "Print"

## Ask a librarian for help using any of these features.

## Only Print "Selected" Text



## Print only highlighted text

Use the mouse to highlight only the text you want to print. Use "Selection."

This appears after you highlight and click "Print"

## Print More Than One Page Per Sheet



Print multiple pages on one sheet
Espec ia lly useful if printing long documents.
(For PowerPoint use the "Ha ndouts" option when printing.)

This appears after you click "Print" in newer versions of Mic rosoft applications. In older, click on "Print," "Preferences," "Finishing."

## E-Mail Text to Yourself RatherThan Printing

Copy text and paste it into a Word document, then send it to yourself as an e-mail attachment. Go paperless.

In library databases, use the e-mail feature.

## Save onto a USB Drive Rather Than Printing

Every student should camy a USB (or "flash") drive. They can cost less than $\$ 10$ and hold huge numbers of documents.
